babacio - n. m. (pr. \ b&b'&[ch]iu \) Inv. at plr. - **1**) - **rag doll, puppet**. - **2**) - **numskull, simpleton, dupe** (in a fig. sense). In this sense see also the terms "*babego, bacicia*".

babàu - n. m. (pr. \ b&b'&eu \) Inv. at plr. - **bugbear, bugaboo, scarecrow**.

babego - n. m. (pr. \ b&b'&egu \) - See **babacio** 2).

babeo - n. and adj. (pr. \ b&b'&eu \) Ms. plr. **babeo** - fm. sng. and plr. **babea, babee**. - **1**) - **numskull, dupe, simpleton, blockhead**. (sbst.). - **2**) - **foolish, stupid, simple** (adj.). - See also the terms "*babicc, folaton, fòl, garola, etc.*".

babèra - n. m. (pr. \ b&b'&ær \) At plr. **babère**. - **little lamb** (female). See also the terms "*bebèra, bèra, bèrra*".

babèro - n. m. (pr. \ b&b'&æru \) Inv. at plr. - **little lamb**. See also the terms "*bebèro, bèro*".

babi - n. m. (pr. \ b'&bi \) Inv. at plr. - **toad** (zoology - *Bufo vulgaris*). A very common piedmontese way of saying making use of this term is: "*Esse al pian dij babi*" = lit. "*To be at the level of the toads*" with a value of "*To be in poverty*", or, in general "*to experience great troubles*".

babia - n. f. (pr. \ b&b'i \) At plr. **babie**. - **1**) - **loquacity, garrulity**. See also the terms "*bacaja, bafoja*". - **2**) - **rhetorical speech**.

babìa - n. f. (pr. \ b&bi' \) Inv. at plr. - **heavy fall, nasty tumble**.

babias - n. m. (pr. \ b&bi'&s \) Inv. at plr. - **bad toad** - pejorative of "*babi*", used also in fig. sense with value of **hideous person**, or **unsociable person**.

babicc - n. and adj. (pr. \ b&b'i'&[ch] \) - See **babeo**.

babié - vrb 1st con. trs. (pr. \ b&bi'e \) - **to huddle**.

babîesse - vrb 1st con. refl. (pr. \ b&bi'ese \) - **to crouch, to cower, to squat, to huddle up, to cuddle up**. See also the term "*anrignésse*".

babiliard - n. and adj. (pr. \ b&bili'&rd \) Ms. plr. **babiliard** - fm. sng. and plr. **babiliarda, babiliarde**. - **1**) - **chatterbox, great talker**. (sbst.). - **2**) - **gossipy** (adj.).

babilònia - n. f. (pr. \ b&bil'oni \) At plr. (if any) **babilònie**. - **confusion, disorder, muddle, bustle**.

babìot - n. m. (pr. \ b&bi'ot \) Inv. at plr. - **1**) - **little toad** (diminutive of "*babi*"). - **2**) - **little boy, chubby child** (in a fig. sense).

babocc - n. m. (pr. \ b&b'u'&[ch] \) Inv. at plr. - **poodle** (dog).

babòcc - 1) - adj. (pr. \ b&b'o'&[ch] \) Ms. plr. **babòcc** - fm. sng. and plr. **babòcia, babòce**. - **1**) - **fool, foolish**.

babòcc - 2) - adj. and n. (pr. \ b&b'o'&[ch] \) Ms. plr. **babòcc** - fm. sng. and plr. **babòcia, babòce**. - **poodle, poodle dog**. See also the term "*bòcc*".

- badé** - 1) - n. (pr. \ b&d'e \) - See **badaloch.**
- badé** - 2) - vrb 1st con. int. (pr. \ b&d'e \) - **1) - to be careful, to take care, to mind.** - **2) - to look after, to care.** - **3) - to watch, to keep an eye.** It uses the aux. "*avèj*". Not very used term, it is quite an italianism. See also the terms "*cudi, ciadlé*" and the vrb. loc. "*dé d'euj*" = "lit. *to give* (of) *eye*", with value "*to watch*".

- badinagi** - n. m. (pr. \ b&din'&ji \) Inv. at plr. - **joke, jest, trick.**

- badoché** - vrb 1st con. int. (pr. \ b&duk'e \) - See **badolé.**
- badofi** - adj. (pr. \ b&d'ufi \) - See **borenfi.**
- badolé** - vrb 1st con. int. (pr. \ b&dul'e \) - **1) - to lounge about, to wander about, to loaf.** - **2) - to idle about, to laze.**
- badò** - n. m. (pr. \ b&d'o \) Inv. at plr. - **1) - burden, load, weight** (often in a fig. sense). - **2) - blame, fault.** Two ways of saying can show better this meaning. A) - "*carié 'l badò*" = lit. "*to charge the blame* (upon sb.)." with value "*to accuse* (sb.)". - B) - "*carièsse 'l badò*" = lit. "*to charge the balme on oneself*" with value "*to take the blame upon oneself*".
- badòla** - n. (pr. \ b&d'ol& \) Used as inv. in gnd. and nr., with the possibility of a fm. plr. "**badòle**" - **1) - idler, loafer.** - **2) - fool, stupid.**
- badraca** - n. f. (pr. \ b&dr'&c& \) At plr. **badrache.** - **1) - old thing, thing out of fashion.** In this sense see also the term "*pataca*". - **2) - old strumpet.** See also the term "*patraca*".
- badsoà** - n. m. (pr. \ b&dsu'& \) Inv. at plr. - **characteristical piedm. dish based on fried legs of pork.** See also the term "*batsoà*".
- bàfer** - n. m. plr. (pr. \ b'&fer \) Only plr. - **moustaches.** See also the terms "*barbison, barbìs*", that can be also sng.
- bafoja** - n. (pr. \ b&fuy& \) Ms. plr. **bafoja** - fm. sng. and plr. **bafoja, bafoje.** - **1) - loquacity, garrulity.** - **2) - great talker, chatterbox, gossip.** - **3) - intriguer.** See also the term "*babìa*".
- bafojé** - vrb 1st con. int. (pr. \ b&fuy'e \) - **1) - to talk idly, to chatter.** - **2) - to deceive with chatters.** It uses the aux. "*avèj*".
- bafrà** - n. f. (pr. \ b&fr'& \) Inv. at plr. - **bellyful, hearty meal.** See also the terms "*balafrà, bafrada, balafrada, sbalafrada*".
- bafrada** - n. f. (pr. \ b&fr'&d& \) Inv. at plr. - **bellyful, hearty meal.** See also the terms "*balafrà, bafrà, balafrada, sbalafrada*".
- bafré** - vrb 1st con. trs. (pr. \ b&fr'e \) - **to have a bellyful, to have a hearty meal to eat greedily, to gorge.** See also the terms "*balafré, sbalafré*".
- bafron** - n. and adj. (pr. \ b&fr'u'ng \) - **1) - great eater, glutton, greedy person** (sbst.). - See also the terms "*balafra, balafron, sbalafron*" - **2) - greedy** (adj.). See also the terms "*balafron, sbalafron, ingòrd*".

- bagagliaio** - (pr. \ b&g'&gli'i&iò \) - Italian word. - See **bagaliaio.**
- bagajé** - vrb 1st con. int. (pr. \ b&g'&y'e \) - See **bacajé.**
- bagaliaio** - n. m. (pr. \ b&gli'i&iò \) Inv. at plr. - **luggage van, luggage compartment, boot.** Not just an italianism, but an italian word which is sometimes used (the only

"piedmontesization" is the deletion of the group "gli" that does not exist in piedm. with fricative pronunciation, substituted by the group "li". See also the word "còfo" when referred to a car, and the loc. "forgon dij bagagi, van dij bagagi, etc.", having the same meanings of the English definitions.

bagara - n. f. (pr. \ b&g'&r& \) At plr. **bagare**. - **1) - muddle, confusion, disorder**. - **2) - tumult, uproar**. See also the term "cernaja".

bagarin - n. m. (pr. \ b&g&r'i[ng] \) Inv. at plr. - **forestaller, scalper**.

bagarinagi - n. m. (pr. \ b&g&rin&ji \) Inv. at plr. - **forestalment, scalping**.

bagassa - n. f. (pr. \ b&g'&s& \) At plr. **bagasse**. - **1) - shameless woman**. - **2) - whore, harlot**.

bagassëtta - n. f. (pr. \ b&g&s'&tt& \) At plr. **bagassëtta**. - **a kind of pancake**. *Lool out!* this is *not* the diminutive of "bagassa".

bagat - n. m. (pr. \ b&g'&t \) - Inv. at plr. - **1) - a card of the tarots card game**. This is one of the many cards of this game, but there is a piedm. way of saying quite used, which is referred to this game and this card: "*scarté bagat*" = lit. "*to discard the bagat*" (usually an error on this game), having the idiomatic meaning of "*to have an escapade, to do a prank*" or, in general, "*to disobey*". - **2) - cobbler, shoe repairer** (slang term).

bàget - n. m. (pr. \ b'&jæt \) - See **bùdget**.

bagian - n. and adj. (pr. \ b&ji'&[ng] \) Ms. plr. **bagian** - fm. sng. and plr. **bagian-a, bagian-e**. (even if usually, as a sbst., is only referred to males and then used at ms.) - **1) - numskull, dupe, stupid person** (sbst.). - **2) - stupid, foolish, doltish**. (adj.).

bagianada - n. f. (pr. \ b&ji'n&d& \) At plr. **bagianade**. - **1) - piece of nonsense**. - **2) - half-witted action, stupidity**. See also the best piedm. term "gavada".

bagn - n. m. (pr. \ b'&[gn] \) Inv. at plr. - **1) - bath**. - **2) - bathe, swim**. - **3) - bathroom**.

bagìgia - n. f. (pr. \ b&ji'ji& \) At plr. **bagìge**. - **groundnut, peanut** (botany - *Arachis hypogaea*). See also the term "giaponèisa".

bagna - n. f. (pr. \ b'&[gn]& \) At plr. **bagne**. - **1) - sauce**. The use of this term is reserved to some particular sauces (not, for example, for pasta). See also the diminutive "*bagnet*", which is msc. and used for other kinds of sauce, and still the terms "*sugo, sàusa*". The Piedmontese most famous *bagna* is the *Bagna Caoda* (Hot Sauce), that is composed by a lot of garlic (at least three or four big cloves of garlic per person) and anchovies (the type preserved in salt, maybe from five to ten per person), cooked and melted in oil that once was often nut's oil, now the olive oil is generally used, but some nuts minced inside recall the original taste. The cooking requires not too much time, with a very small fire in order not to burn the garlic, that has to melt in oil without making boil the oil itself (then the anchovies are added and melt as well). This sauce has to remain hot while eaten (from this the name comes) and on purpose it is kept inside a tureen with a little fire below. Nowadays individual little tureens are used, but the original way was (and sometimes it is still now) to have a common tureen in the middle of the table. It is eaten by dipping all sort of raw and cooked vegetables, and first of all the famous piedmontese "*card gheub*" raw (literally the "*hump-backed cardoon*") tasty and bitter. This is a meal for a group of friends, classical in the Autumn (its origin is the celebration of the end of vintage). Of course a good wine is strictly required (Barbera one year old, Freisa, Dosset, etc. but not too strong, old, expensive wines, good for another occasion - at least in my opinion-). At the end a cup of beef and chicken broth, followed by some piedm. cakes, can

conclude the meal. The only problem with "bagna cauda" is that the breath of table-companions will dreadfully smell for a couple of days (or more, but it is worth while!). - **2) - juice**. See also the terms "*giuss, sugo*". - **3) - trouble** (in a fig. sense). This is a piedm. idiomatic meaning. The expression "*esse ant la bagna*", that lit. means "*to be in the sauce*", actually means "*to be in big troubles*". Similarly "*lassé quaidun ant la bagna*" = lit. "*to leave (sb.) in the sauce*" means "*to leave (sb.) in troubles*". These expressions are commonly very used. - There is another piedm. idiomatic expression making use of the term "bagna", which is "*perde la bagna*" = lit. "*to lose the sauce*", whose meaning is "*to be tired, to be exhausted*" and therefore no more in condition of continuing the march.

bagnada - n. f. (pr. \ b&[gn]'&d& \) At plr. **bagnade**. - **wetting**.

bagnadura - n. f. (pr. \ b&[gn]'&d'ue[r& \) At plr. **bagnadure**. - **bathing**.

bagné - vrb 1st con. trs. (pr. \ b&[gn]'e \) - **1) - to bathe, to wet, to dip, to soak, to water**. - **2) - to flow through** (rivers), **to wash** (seas). See also the terms "*mojé, seivé, anrosé, rosiné, etc.*".

bagnésse - vrb 1st con. refl. (pr. \ b&[gn]'ese \) - **1) - to bathe, to wet**. (oneself). - **2) - to have a bath**. - **3) - to get wat, to get soaked**. - A joky piedm. way of saying is "*bagnésse 'l bech*" = lit. "*to wet one's beak*" with a value of "*to drink*".

bagnet - n. m. (pr. \ b&[gn]'æt \) Inv. at plr. - **sauce, gravy**. (usually for meat). A typical piedm. "*bagnet*" is the "*bagnet verd*" = lit. "*green sauce*", one of the sauces used for mixed boiled meat. Main ingredients are: parsley (main component), some anchovies preserved in salt, some capers, soft part of bread soaked with vinegar, garlic, hot pepper (Cayenne pepper), 2 yolks of hard-boiled eggs, olive oil. There are at least two groups of versions, one is cooked and the other raw, but here we don't go in details.

bagneul - n. m. (pr. \ b&[gn]'oe \) At plr. **bagneuj**. - **pit for slaking quicklime**.

bagnëtta - n. f. (pr. \ b&[gn]'&tt& \) At plr. **bagnëtta**. - **1) - sap**. - **2) - lymph**. - **3) - In general any liquid or viscous substance not better identified**. The term is a popular one.

Then there are some idiomatic way of saying making use of this word. - A) - "*buté an carta*" = lit "*to put in paper*" = "*to put in writing*". - B) - "*buté a meuj*" = "*to dip, to soak*". - C) - "*buté an tren*" or "*buté an brando*" = "*to start, to begin*". - D) - "*buté an fàula*" or "*buté an butlètta*" = "*to deride, to mock, to laugh at*". - E) - "*buté an balansa*" = "*to put in equilibrium*" or (in fig. sense) "*to take into account, to consider*". - F) - "*buté an solevassion*" = "*to provoke a riot*". - G) - "*buté bin*" = lit. "*to put well*" = "*to promise well*". - H) - "*buté da part*" = "*to save, to save up*". - I) - "*buté mal*" = lit. "*to put evil*" = "*to sow dissension*". - L) - etc.

"*to put one's bones to heap*" = "*to work very hard, to overwork*".

Often in Piedm. this concept is expressed by vrbl. loc. not present in other languages, and with a particular syntax. Also the vrb. "*venté*" has to be seen. The aux. used can be "*avèj*" or "*esse*", according to the particular case (usually the aux. is "*esse*"). Some examples can be useful, which uses also the said vrbl. loc. :

- A) - "*a bzògna andé*" = "*a venta andé*" = "*it is necessary to go*". In this case the vrb "*venté*" and "*bzogné*" are fully equivalent.

- B) - "*a l'han da manca dij ciò*" = "*they need the nails*". This expression uses the vrbl. loc. "*avèj da manca*" (*èd*), that could be approximately transated lit. into "*to have by lack of*" which is a nonsense. The expression is int. but prs.

- C) - "*a-i é da manca ch'it ven-e*" = "*there is the need that you come*" = "*you have to come*". This expression uses the vrbl. loc. "*essie da manca*" (*èd*), that could be approximately transated lit. into "*to be there by lack of*" which is even more a nonsense. The expression is imp.

- D) - "*a bzognavo èd tut*" = "*a l'avio da manca èd tut*" = "*they needed all*".
